It is the endemic species to inhabit only Madagascar. It is considered that this pattern is "Crypsis" to avoid observation ordetection by other animals and to help protect themselves in the wild. However, it is popular as pets due to the beautiful pattern, so thepopulation is decreasing by the overhunting in the wild habitats, andlisted as critically endangered in the IUCN Red List of Threatened Species.At the present, it is internationally protected, but poaching and smuggling are still never ending.
